

Reminder: Annual CMS Medicare Part D Disclosure

February 8, 2018

Each year as part of the annual notification requirements under the Medicare Modernization Act (MMA), employer sponsored group health plans that offer prescription drug coverage are required to disclose the plan's creditable coverage status to the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS). The disclosure is due 60 days after the first day of each plan year, and for calendar year plans it should be made by March 2.

To assist employers with their CMS disclosure, this alert provides a general summary of the Medicare Part D requirements including a review of:

- employers impacted by Medicare Part D,
- · timing of the disclosure,
- the CMS Creditable Coverage Disclosure online form, and
- available CMS guidance and instructions.

Employers Subject to Medicare Part D

Employers who offer prescription drug coverage to their active employees or retirees, and have Medicare eligible employees or dependents covered under their prescription drug plan are subject to the Medicare Part D notification requirements.

Timing of Creditable Coverage Disclosure

The Online Disclosure to CMS Form is to be completed within 60 days after the first day of each plan year. For example, the first day of a 2018 calendar year plan is January 1, 2018. The disclosure deadline is 60 days after the first day of the plan year and therefore, the notice for this plan is to be filed with CMS on or before March 2, 2018.

In addition, if during the plan year any change in the prescription drug plan coverage affects the plan's creditable coverage status, a new disclosure form must be filed with CMS within 30 days.

CMS Creditable Coverage Disclosure Online Form

In order to provide their plan's creditable coverage status to CMS, employer sponsored group health plans are required to complete and submit the "Online Disclosure to CMS Form". This disclosure provides CMS with current information regarding the plan's creditable coverage status including general employer information, the number of prescription drug plans offered and their creditable coverage status, the number of Medicare Part D individuals covered under the plan, and the date that the annual creditable coverage notice was distributed.

An employer is required to complete the Online Disclosure on the CMS Creditable Coverage Disclosure web page with electronic filing being the sole method for compliance with the disclosure requirement. The only exception to the online disclosure is for an employer that does not have internet access. To access this page directly, <u>click here</u>.
